

The IRS allows you to claim a tax credit for home solar panels as part of the residential clean energy credit. For tax years 2022 to 2032, you can get a credit for up to 30% of the expense of installing solar panels; this may include the price of the panels themselves, sales taxes and labor costs. To claim the solar tax credit, you'll need first to determine if you're eligible, then complete IRS Form 5695 and finally add your renewable energy tax credit information to Schedule 3 and Form 1040. What is Form 5695?

Form 5695 is the official IRS tax form you must use to claim the federal solar tax credit when you file your taxes.

Please see our Privacy Policy for more information and details on how to opt out. To claim your tax credit for solar panels, you must file Form 5695, Residential Energy Credits, along with Form 1040, for the year the panels were installed. You'll need the following information to file your form:

When can I claim a solar system tax credit?

The credit can be claimed for the tax year when the solar system was placed in service. If your project isn't finished (e.g., waiting on final inspection or utility hookup) until January, then it's "placed in service" in that year, not the previous one. So install timelines matter for which year's return to claim the credit.

The Inflation Reduction Act renamed and extended the existing solar tax credit through 2034 for solar system installations on residential property. It also increased the credit's value. 


Can I claim a credit for new solar panels?


