Why did the EPA terminate a \$7 billion solar grant program?

JOHN and MATTHEW DALY WASHINGTON (AP) — The Environmental Protection Agency on Thursday terminated a \$7 billion grant program intended to help pay for residential solar projects for more than 900,000 lower-income U.S. households, in the latest Trump administration move hindering the nation's shift to cleaner energy.

What is the \$7 billion solar for all program?

Under the \$7 billion Solar for All program, the 60 grant recipients will create new or expand existing low-income solar programs, which will enable over 900,000 households in low-income and disadvantaged communities to benefit from distributed solar energy.

What does EPA expect from solar for all grantees?

community ownership to American communities and households. EPA expects Solar for All grantees to maximize the breadth and diversity of households served in the program, including rural, urban, and suburban communities; energy communities; and persistent poverty counties, while prioritizing investing in the most disadvantaged and low-income households.

Why did EPA grant 60 solar grants in 2024?

In April 2024, EPA awarded 60 grants to states, territories, Tribal governments, municipalities, and nonprofits to expand the number of low-income and disadvantaged communities primed for residential solar investment—enabling millions of low-income households to access affordable, resilient, and clean solar energy.

Who will receive a \$7 billion solar grant?

Washington – Today, April 22, as the Biden-Harris Administration celebrates Earth Day, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency announced 60 selectees



that will receive \$7 billion in grant awards through the Solar for All grant competition to deliver residential solar projects to over 900,000 households nationwide.


