The NEM 3.0 scheme allows solar system owners to export excess electricity back to the grid and receive a 1:1 credit offset on their electricity bills. It's available under three categories: NEM credits can be rolled over for up to 12 months. The scheme runs until 30 June 2025, with quotas still.

The rebate for the installation of solar systems, up to RM4,000, under the Solar for Rakyat Incentive Scheme (SolaRIS), will be extended until April 30, 2025, the Ministry of Energy Transition and Water Transformation announced in a statement today. — AFP file pic Stay updated on the latest news.

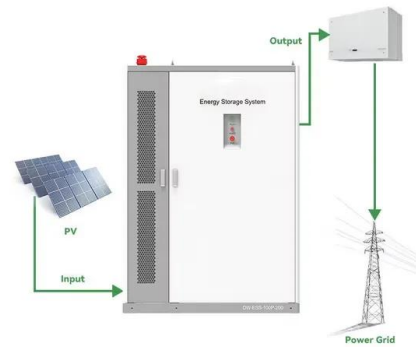
