99.86% of the solar system's mass is found in the Sun. The majority of the remaining 0.14% is contained within the eight planets. The four smaller inner



planets, also known as the “terrestrial planets”, are primarily composed of rock and metal.

What is a small body in the Solar System?

Any natural solar system object other than the Sun, a planet, a dwarf planet, or a moon is called a small body; these include asteroids, meteoroids, and comets. Most of the more than one million asteroids, or minor planets, orbit between Mars and Jupiter in a nearly flat ring called the asteroid belt.

Why is the Solar System so important?

The solar system is more than a collection of planets orbiting a star. It is a grand narrative of creation, chaos, evolution, and potential. It is our home, our origin, and perhaps our future. From the fiery heart of the Sun to the icy comets on the edge of interstellar space, every object, every grain of dust, plays a role in this cosmic symphony.

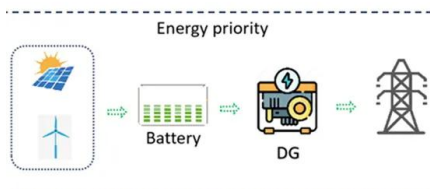
