Solar for All is a \$7 billion competitive grants program administered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. In April 2024, EPA awarded 60 grants to states, territories, Tribal governments, municipalities, and nonprofits to expand the number of low-income and disadvantaged communities primed.

In April 2024, EPA awarded 60 grants to states, territories, Tribal governments, municipalities, and nonprofits to expand the number of low-income and disadvantaged communities primed for residential solar investment—enabling millions of low-income households to access affordable, resilient, and clean solar energy.

What is the new solar energy program?

This new program aims to promote clean energy adoption, reduce energy costs, and address environmental justice concerns by ensuring that solar benefits reach underserved populations. As for now, \$7 billion have been allocated to expand access to solar energy for low-income households across the United States.

What is a solar for all grant?

Reaching communities in all states and territories, including in Tribal Lands, maximizing the reach and breadth of Solar for All. Collectively, the 60 Solar for All grant recipients will implement programs that cover all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and several territories.

What is solar for all?

"Solar for All is an investment in energy infrastructure that's going to serve that residential customer that's going to keep energy rates in America more affordable and more fair," she said. Solar for All awarded grants in August 2024 to 49 state-level agencies, six tribes and five multi-state award recipients, according to the EPA.

Who received solar for all grants in 2024?
