Why did EPA grant 60 solar grants in 2024?

In April 2024, EPA awarded 60 grants to states, territories, Tribal governments, municipalities, and nonprofits to expand the number of low-income and disadvantaged communities primed for residential solar investment—enabling millions of low-income households to access affordable, resilient, and clean solar energy.

Who administers California's Solar for all grant?

Three agencies are overseeing the administration of the State's Solar for All Grant: the California Public Utilities Commission, the California Energy Commission, and the California Labor and Workforce Development Agency via the Employment Development Department. Each agency is implementing their own portion of the grant-funded work.

Who received solar for all grants in 2024?



Solar for All awarded grants in August 2024 to 49 state-level agencies, six tribes and five multi-state award recipients, according to the EPA. They include state agencies like the Alaska Energy Authority, which was granted a \$62 million award to offer access to renewable energy in both urban and rural areas.
