In 2025, the federal Investment Tax Credit (ITC) allows homeowners to claim 30% of their solar panel system costs as a tax credit on their federal taxes. Starting January 1, 2026, the residential solar tax credit will disappear completely. There is no cap to the value you can claim for your credit.

Adding solar panels to your home can save you money — not only on your utility bills, but also at tax time. That's because installing solar panels is one of the energy-related upgrades that can make you eligible for the residential clean energy tax credit. This federal tax credit isn't new, but it. How do I claim a tax credit for solar panels?

To claim your tax credit for solar panels, you must file Form 5695, Residential Energy Credits, along with Form 1040, for the year the panels were installed. You'll need the following information to file your form: Qualified expenses include labor costs for preparation, assembly and wiring, the price of the panels, taxes and other specified costs.

Can you get a solar tax credit?

The U.S. government offers a solar tax credit that can help you recoup up to 30% of the cost of installing a solar power system. The residential clean energy credit also covers other types of renewable energy projects undertaken by homeowners, subject to certain guidelines. To claim the solar tax credit, you'll have to fill out IRS Form 5695.

Do you pay taxes on solar panels?

Most homeowners with a decent tax bill will fall into this category, using up the credit in the installation year and enjoying a much lower tax payment. In essence, the government just covered \$7,500 of their solar costs through the tax system.



## Can I claim a solar PV tax credit in 2023?

Yes. Generally, you can claim a tax credit on the expenses related to the new solar PV system that already came installed on the house for the year in which you moved into the house (assuming the builder did not claim the tax credit)—in other words, you may claim the credit in 2023.

Can a renter claim a tax credit if a solar system is installed?
