Brushing breaks down and removes some material, making the next steps in the cleaning process more effective.

How do you clean a solar panel if it rains?

Leaves, bird droppings, and dust accumulate on solar panels. Even though rain clears some of this, it doesn't get everything and can create dirty residue when puddles evaporate. Debris can be removed with gentle brushing from a soft-bristled tool to start the cleaning process.

How often should a solar panel be cleaned?

Regular solar panel cleaning is essential for maximizing energy efficiency and savings. Cleaning frequency depends on factors like location, panel tilt, and rainfall – aim for 1-2 cleanings per year. DIY solar panel cleaning is doable with the right tools and techniques, like using soft brushes, squeegees, and mild soap.



What should I do if my solar panels get dirty?

Shut off your solar panel system – this ensures your safety and that your equipment won't get damaged. Use a soft brush to clean the surface of your dirty solar panels to remove debris like dirt and dust. Never use a rough or coarse brush as it could damage your panels.
