The Solar System consists of the Sun and the objects that orbit it. The name comes from Sōl, the Latin name for the sun. It was when a dense region of a molecular cloud collapsed, creating the Sun.

The Solar System formed at least 4.568 billion years ago from the gravitational collapse of a region within a large molecular cloud. This initial cloud was likely several light-years across and probably birthed several stars.

The Sun is the Solar System's star and by far its most massive component. Its large mass (332,900 Earth masses), which comprises 99.86% of all.
